

East Tennessee District Church of the Nazarene Children's Camp Information

All campers and Junior Counselors (ages 15-17) must have a registration form and a Children's Ministries Notarized Form (2 pages) completed prior to camp.

Camp Guidelines:

1. No fireworks, firearms, paint ball guns, spray paint, knives, tobacco, drugs or alcohol. Violators will be sent home.
2. We prefer no electronic equipment. Absolutely no video game devices. If you must send a cell phone with your camper then that phone must remain in the dorm at all times and is the responsibility of the camper.
3. Mattresses should be covered with a sheet even if a sleeping bag is used. Most beds for campers will be twin sized bunk beds. However, we do have one dorm that has full size beds in it that at times campers will share.
4. Campers and counselors are asked to dress modestly with shoes worn at all times. Unacceptable items include: short shorts, low cut tops or low hanging bottoms revealing cleavage or underwear. For the swimming pool all females should wear a one-piece swim suit that covers adequately (Absolutely no 2 piece swim suits allowed unless it is a tankini style that covers the abdomen and meets the bottom portion). All males should wear swim shorts.
5. Please do not send good clothing that may be ruined or left behind. It is a good idea to place your camper's name and church on all items as we always have extra clothing and towels left behind on the last day.
6. Please advise your camper that they must not use any foul language.
7. Your camper must check in with the camp nurse at registration to be checked for head lice. This will ensure the safety of all the campers.
8. Please review the attached COVID Sheet for further details.

Telephone & Security:

1. No counselor should allow a camper to use his/her phone unless specifically authorized by the camper's parent or legal guardian. Should a camper need to make a phone call, that call must be done through the Camp Coordinator or a Counselor from the camper's home church.
2. Parents/Legal Guardians may call the Camp Coordinator at any time to check on your camper during the week of camp.
3. All visitors must notify the Camp Coordinator upon arriving on camp property.
4. All campers must be inside the dorms and accounted for at lights out. No camper is to be outside the dorm for any reason after lights out unless there is a medical need and then must be accompanied by a Junior or Adult Counselor.
5. Do not send any money with the camper. All snacks and meals are included. There are soda machines, however we prefer your camper not drink caffeinated beverages during camp as the temperatures are usually high and this will dehydrate your child more. We will be providing a plastic bottle for each camper they will carry all week and fill up with water. This is the best way to keep your camper hydrated and feeling well.

A Parent/Legal Guardian and Pastor will be contacted if a child is in violation of Camp Rules and the child will be sent home at the expense and inconvenience of the Parent/Legal Guardian.

PACKING LIST:

Bible, Soap, Shampoo, Toothbrush/Paste, Hygiene items, Towels, Washcloths, Sleeping Bag, Sheet, Pillow, Blanket, Clothes including socks, shoes, swimsuit, Medications (To be given to nurse upon arrival).
